



## **Train-the-Trainer on Creative Commons Licenses (CC-licenses) and the Open Data Commons Open Database License (ODbL)**

Funding agencies and publishers are increasingly requesting researchers to make data available in public repositories and databases. When publishing data, researchers should always apply an appropriate usage license that defines permissions and restrictions for others to re-use the data.

The <u>Open Knowledge Foundation</u> offers a suite of open data licenses, the <u>Creative Commons</u> (CC) which are implemented by many data repositories and which are broadly recommended for public datasets, e.g. by the European Commission. Correspondingly, the Open Data Commons Open Database License (<u>ODbL</u>) from Open Knowledge Foundation is applicable to databases.

In this three hours workshop, <u>Martin von Haller</u> will introduce the different CC-licenses and the ODbL. We will also discuss use cases in order to better understand how and when to apply the different licenses. Participants of the workshop are welcome to bring their own cases for the discussion.
